Second Work Day Friday, July 14, 2023

For the evening's activities, we will begin at 4:00 p.m.

Jobs still to be done:

1. Any cleaning which may need to be done again in the bathrooms and large meeting room.
2. Empty trash.
3. Mow and weed-eat as needed. Sweep all sidewalks after mowing and weed eating.
4. Set up livestock panels.
5. Inventory of outside belongings.
6. Finish setting up the 4-H building in preparation for the fair.

In order to do these things, everyone will need to bring tools they might need such as cleaning supplies, screwdrivers, screws, drills, hammers, masking tape, buckets, hoses, ladders, weed eaters, shovels, wheel barrows, rakes, etc.

Style Revue Judging Schedule

Scripts are due Monday, July 10th, in the Extension Office.

For those of you who are enrolled in the buymanship or constructed fashion revue, you appear **in your outfit** before the judge one time only. You should have 1 entry card per outfit and picture of you in your outfit and picture of the project. You will also need one 4-H Fashion Revue Evaluation Scorecard for each entry. Bring this to the person lining you up to the judge with your entry card. Remember, you **DO** need pictures for the county judging. There WILL NOT be call backs so a picture of you in each outfit attached to the evaluation are very important. This is for both Buymanship and Construction projects. You may model your garments in any order you choose. It will not make any difference.

Please note: The judging will be held at St. Agnes Catholic Education Center, in Grainfield, on Friday, July 14, at 10:00 a.m., and the Public Style Revue will be at the 4-H Building on Wednesday, July 19, at 7:00 p.m. Good Luck to all of you!!

Style Revue Participants

For all those who are enrolled in Clothing Construction, you will need to bring the following to the fair:

1. Your constructed and/or buymanship projects.
2. Your fashion revue score card for each constructed outfit.
3. Your fashion revue score cards for each buymanship outfit.
4. 4 x 6 picture of you in the outfit.

Open Class - For those of you who participate but are not enrolled, the display at the fair is optional. You may bring your outfits if you would like to.

Ideas for Questions

Following is a list of possible clothing construction and style revue questions you might be asked during a conference evaluation. Try not to answer with only a "yes" or "no" answer. Of course, there will probably not be time for all of them.

1. Why did you select these colors?
2. What kind of care will the garment(s) need?
3. What is the fiber content?
4. Why did you take this project?
5. How much experience did you have before you started this project?
6. What did you like most about the project?
7. What did you like least about the project?
8. What did you do the first time in this project?
9. Where did you get help?
10. What new things did you learn?
11. How will you use what you have learned?
12. What would you like to learn next?
13. If you were to do the project again, would you do anything differently? How do you feel

- your project could be improved?
14. How does this garment fit in with the other garments in your wardrobe?
 15. Where do you plan to wear this garment?
 16. What accessories are you planning or what accessories do you already have to wear with this garment?
 17. What do you think your ribbon placing should be?

Fair Entry Tags

The **4-H Entry Tags** will be available for you to pick up on Monday, July 17, at the fairgrounds. Please be aware that we are moving away from using the old handwritten entry tags. Make many choices when doing your online entries to ensure a tag is created. The exhibit limits are still enforced. Families will be asked to "scratch" extra entries when fair week begins. Scratches will be made by slashing a RED mark across cards. Markers will be provided. 2023 will be the last year for handwritten 4-H Tags. Starting in 2024 all entries must be completed.

Open Class exhibit cards are available from a Fair Board Member (Dusty Zerr) and must be paid for at the time of pick up. They will be available at both clean ups as well.

After Fair Clean Up July 20, 2023

Please remember that **everyone** has clean up duties at the fairgrounds after the fair.

We clean up on the last evening of the fair, so that we won't have to schedule a clean-up at a later date. Here are the jobs to be done:

- Kitchen Clean Up
- Restrooms
- Large meeting room area
- Pick up litter on the Grounds
- Load table & chairs into storage building on racks.

ALL FAMILIES SHOWING LIVESTOCK – Clean livestock area and your own pens.

Please remember that all the work has to be done. It will be very welcome if you get done early with your job to help someone else out with their work. **All livestock exhibitors must sign out with livestock chairperson!!**

Herdsmanship Award

This year one belt buckle will be given out for overall herdsman. There will be a grand champion of each species: beef, sheep, swine, goat, and horse. They will receive grand champion prize.

A few things that the judge will be looking for are:

1. Proper care and feeding of animals.
 2. Exhibitor conduct (your attitude and behavior in and around the barn, willingness to help others, politeness, no foul language, etc.)
 3. Proper stall and pen identification.
 4. Cleanliness of animals, alleys and stalls.
 5. Safety of animals, use of equipment in a safe manner and safety of other exhibitors.
 6. Presentation of your area: arrangement, cleanliness, organization of equipment, colorful (decorate your area if you wish)
- **If you choose to decorate your area, I would encourage you to make sure that it is a positive reflection of 4-H, possibly relates to the fair theme and/or promotes the species that you are exhibiting.**
- **Judging for Herdsmanship will end on Thursday, July 20, at Noon.**
